



Information about Little Lake City School District's Measure LL Classroom Repair, Health, and Safety Measure

Q: What is Measure LL?

A: Measure LL is the Little Lake City School District Classroom Repair, Health and Safety Measure that will appear on your June 7 Ballot.

Q: Why was Measure LL placed on the ballot?

A: While Little Lake City School District is one of the top performing school districts in our region, many of our schools were built 70 years ago. Our schools need health and safety repairs, including testing for asbestos and lead.

Q: What health and safety upgrades are included in Measure LL?

A: If enacted, Measure LL funding will help our local school district repair deteriorating bathrooms, leaky roofs, cracked asphalt and aging playgrounds; upgrade air filtration and purification; improve plumbing and electrical wiring, meet current earthquake safety standards, and fulfill accessibility requirements for disabled students. Measure LL also includes basic security upgrades to keep intruders off of our campuses.

Q: What about technology upgrades?

A: One of our top priorities is ensuring that all students continue to have access to computers and instructional technology. Measure LL provides funds to help us upgrade outdated electrical wiring, improve science, engineering, and computer instruction, and enhance Internet access.

Q: What other priorities would Measure LL address?

- ✓ Removes asbestos, mold, and lead paint
 - ✓ Repairs gas lines/deteriorating bathrooms
 - ✓ Provides safe drinking water
 - ✓ Improves emergency communications systems in neighborhood schools

Q: Does Measure LL include fiscal accountability requirements?

A: Yes. Measure LL requires Independent Citizens Oversight, annual audits to ensure no funds go towards administrators' salaries and benefits, and public disclosure of all spending. By law, all Measure LL funds must be used for Little Lake City schools and cannot be taken by the State.

Q: How much will it cost?

A: Measure LL is an \$36,000,000 school bond measure. If passed, it will cost homeowners 3 cents per \$100 of assessed value, for a maximum financing term of up to thirty-two years.
