# **Registration**

The Little Lake City School District will continue to use an online registration system. You will be <u>sent</u> <u>an email by the end of July</u> with directions on how to register your student for the upcoming school year. Completing this registration will ensure your student is placed in a class. The office will be open beginning <u>Monday</u>, <u>August 7th from 8am - 4pm</u> and will be able to provide support with registration. Please note, students will not be placed on a class list until they are registered.

# <u>Attendance</u>

Good attendance is an important characteristic of a successful elementary student. Even elementary school attendance is one of the most important predictors of which students will graduate from high school. Attending school each day allows students to stay current with instruction, practice important grade level skills and receive the support they need to be successful. Poor attendance can also have a negative effect on social emotional development. For example, students who are chronically absent in the early years of their education may not learn crucial school readiness skills (like critical thinking, problem solving, and creative thinking), and can fall behind their peers in social emotional development. A student is considered chronically absent by the state of California for missing just two days of school a month or a total of 18 days in a school year. Even attending part of the school day (in the morning or afternoon) can help. If your child does have to miss school please contact the school office. If your student has to miss three or more days of school due to a family event or illness please request a short term independent study contract. This will allow us to send assignments home so your child can practice grade level skills and the absences will not be counted toward their total.

### Back to School Tips and Reminders

Back-to-School is an exciting time! It can also be a stressful time as we try to prepare for the upcoming year. The following guidelines help promote the safety and success of all our Cresson Cougars.

- Please keep your contact information (phone, address, email) current. If a need arises we want to contact you as quickly as possible.
- Check your email for communication from the classroom teacher and information about school events.
- Use extreme caution and patience when driving near the school during drop off and pick up times. Please use the designated areas when you drop off or pick up your student and pull over to the curb.
- Please model safety for all the students by using the crosswalks when crossing the street.
- Please remember there is no supervision before 7:45am. At 7:45am the gate opens and students may enter campus to get breakfast or wait for school to begin. The gate is locked at 8:15am when classes begin and students will have to enter through the office after that time.
- Children should not bring games, toys, sports equipment or electronics to school.
- Due to health and safety concerns, do not send food items (cookies, cupcakes, etc) to the class to celebrate your child's birthday. If you wish to honor the occasion with a treat please send a special book for the classroom library or stickers and pencils for the students. Students can enjoy these items day after day as a reminder of your child's special day.
- Wednesdays are always minimum days. Please make arrangements for your student to be picked up at 1:30pm on Wednesdays.
- You are an important part of the Cresson team. Please contact your child's teacher or the office if you have any questions or concerns.

# School Safety

All schools in the Little Lake City School District are closed campuses for student safety. For added safety, from now on, the front office doors will remain closed and locked. If you need to access the school office to pick up a student, drop off items, or for any other reason, please call the office (562-868-6620) or knock on the door.

### School Communication

It is our goal that information is shared frequently and in a variety of ways so that families have access to important information and news on a regular basis. We will communicate with families in the following ways:

- Parent Portal and Class Dojo will be the primary means of communication. Please check these apps at least once a week to stay current on school news.
- Wednesday folders will continue to be used to share some information.
- The school newsletter will go out once per month with news and information about upcoming events.
- The marquee in front of the school will share upcoming events.
- Progress reports and report cards will go home twice a month to keep you informed about your child's progress.
- Teachers will send home periodic information that is specific to their classrooms. Teachers communicate through email or text via Class Dojo or Remind.
- We do not interrupt classroom instruction with phone calls, but parents can reach teachers and the principal by calling the office and leaving a message or requesting an appointment. You can get a message directly to the staff by emailing them.
